I. PURPOSE

The purpose of this Administrative Directive is to advise local social services districts of the allocation of closed-ended Federal and State services funds for the Federal Fiscal Year 1980-81 (see attached Appendix A).

II. BACKGROUND

New York State's share of the Federal Title XX basic social services funds allotment has been reduced this year by 1.77%. All local districts' ceilings have been reduced accordingly. However, those districts which receive under \$6 per capita in their basic Title XX Federal allocation will share in an additional allocation totaling \$7.28 million in an effort to reduce their deficit. These are shown as "Additional Allocation A". This year there will also be an additional allocation "B" which is being distributed in proportion to the sum of the basic allocation and additional allocation "A".

III. PROGRAM IMPLICATION

The amounts stated in Appendix A represent the Federal and State ceilings on reimbursements for services expenditures for program year 1980-81. As indicated, there is no State funding required for additional allocation "B" since this represents a pass-through of 100% Federal funding. As was done in prior years, any unused service funds will be reallocated among those districts having expenditures in excess of this closed-ended allocation at the end of Federal Fiscal Year 1980-81.
