This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns: A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

The SCR report alleged on 1/10/21, the mother attempted suicide by jumping from the roof of a building onto the cemented ground with her five-year-old child. As a result of the fall, both the mother and child were transported to the emergency room by ambulance, where they were listed in critical condition. The SM was pronounced dead at 2:00 PM and the SC at 2:04 PM.

Executive Summary

This fatality report concerns the death of a five-year-old female subject child that occurred on 1/10/21. A report was made to the SCR on that same date with allegations of Inadequate Guardianship and DOA/Fatality against the child's mother. The Administration for Children's Services (ACS) received the report and investigated the child's death. An autopsy was completed. The ME listed the SC's cause of death as blunt impact injuries of the torso and the manner was homicide.

At the time of the child's death, there were no surviving siblings or other children in the home. The child resided with her parents and maternal grandmother.

ACS initiated the report by collaborating with LE. ACS learned that the SM had planned to meet with friends at one of the friend's apartment. Upon arrival to the building, the SM who had been experiencing major depression, went to the thirteenth floor and jumped while holding the SC in her arms. A passerby called 911 at 1:32PM and alerted the building security of the incident. EMS arrived on the scene at 1:40 PM and transported the SM and SC to the ER.

The medical staff pronounced the SC and SM dead at 2:00PM and 2:04PM respectively on 1/10/21. LE reported no one else was involved in the incident. The father was at work at the time of the incident.

During the investigation, ACS learned the MGM and the father were aware of the SM's mental health issues; however, they did not suspect the SM would harm the SC.

On 2/22/21, ACS substantiated the allegation of DOA/fatality and IG of the SC by the SM citing findings from the ME and LE.

LDSS Response

On 1/10/21, the ACS Specialist visited and interviewed the BF at the case address. He reportedly had limited interaction with the family for a few weeks due to the type of his employment and the COVID-19 pandemic. He reported the SM was greatly affected by the isolation surrounding the pandemic as she was normally a very active and out-going person. He reported he was divorced from the SM in 2020 and that also had a negative effect on the SM. The BF also stated he was unaware of the SM's exact mental health conditions but was aware she had difficulty sleeping and the medication she was taking did not help. He reported he had recently communicated with the SC on Skype and she was happy. The BF reported he had no mental health conditions, DV or substance abuse history.

The SM's female friend corroborated the SM's difficulty with the pandemic and divorce. She noted the SM was also worried about financial matters. According to the friend, the SM was hospitalized for two days in a mental health institution in August 2020. The SM told the friend that the medication made her feel worse, so she tried to wean herself. She was also insecure of her ability to love the SC and at one point stated she was looking for someone to adopt the SC.

On 1/14/21, the Specialist interviewed the MGM with the assistance of a language interpreter. The MGM reported information similar to the SM's female friend regarding the SM's mental health issues and concerns. She added that she did not think the SM would harm the SC because she loved her very much.

The Specialist learned from the SM's clinician that the SM had been diagnosed with major depressive disorder, anxiety, and obsessive compulsive disorder. She had been receiving mental health treatment at the time of death; however, the SM discontinued therapy stating it was not beneficial. The clinician discussed hospitalization with the SM, and she declined. The SM had been prescribed medication.

The SC's school staff reported the SC was a happy child who was looking forward to first grade. She was never found with any signs that indicated maltreatment or abuse. The SM and SC appeared fine.

The Specialist interviewed the PU, and other family friends and they all reported the mother loved the SC very much and had never showed signs that she would harm the SC. Neighbors reportedly had known very little about the family and one neighbor noted that the SM appeared sad. The family declined bereavement counseling.

The ME listed the cause of death blunt impact injuries of the torso and the manner was homicide. The DA and LE reported

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there was no active criminal investigation as the SM and SC were not pushed. A video clearly reflected the SC struggling with the SM, who grabbed her and leaped from the roof.

On 2/22/21, ACS substantiated the allegations of DOA/Fatality and Inadequate Guardianship of the SC by the SM citing the results of their investigation. ACS documented the SM committed suicide by jumping to her death from the thirteenth floor and committed homicide by holding the SC in her arms as she jumped. To support the decision, ACS documented the ME listed the cause of death of the SC as blunt impact injuries of the torso and the manner was homicide.
